Who Should Apply?

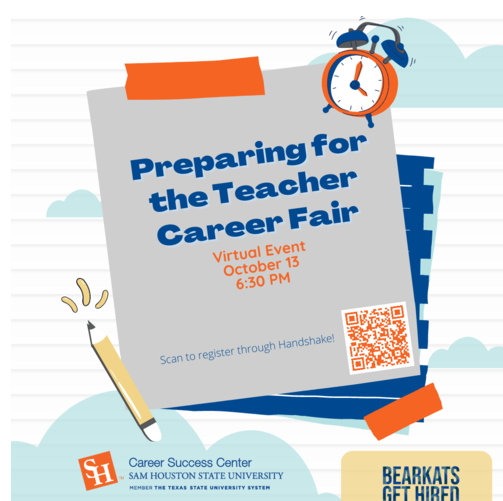
All PK-3, EC-6 Core, EC-6 Bilingual, EC-6 Special Education and all 4-8 students are encouraged to apply.

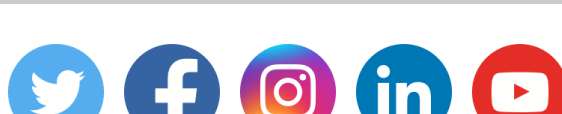
