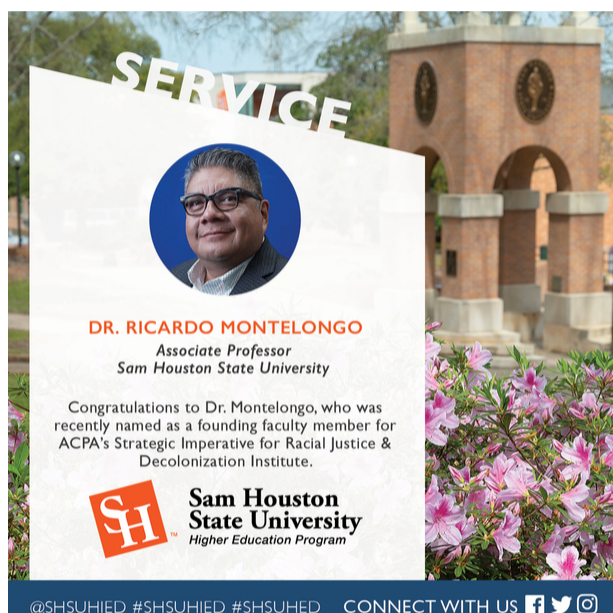

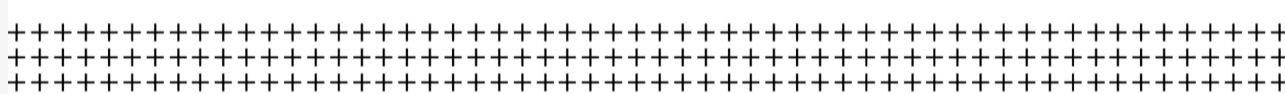


Dr. Meredith Billings, was selected for SHSU's Community Engaged Scholars. Congratulations!
