

## Charlotte N. Royall

Charlotte Royall is retired Director of Bands at The Woodlands College Park HS. Prior to College Park, she taught at Wells Middle School and Bammel Middle School in Spring, ISD, and Knox JH in Conroe ISD. She graduated from the University of Houston with a bachelor's degree in music education, and a master's degree in Instrumental Conducting from Sam Houston State University.

Mrs. Royall's middle school performing ensembles earned consistent Sweepstakes and Outstanding in Class awards. In 1990, the Bammel MS Symphonic Band was named the Texas Music Educators Association Class CC State Honor Band and performed at the state convention in San Antonio, in 1991. The band was a top three finalist in the Class CCC State Honor Band competition in 1996 and 1998.

The College Park HS band consistently earned Superior ratings at UIL Marching and Concert and Sightreading contest in every year of its existence, also receiving Outstanding in Class Awards at marching and concert festivals. In 2010, the College Park Wind Ensemble was a state Finalist in the TMEA Class 5A Honor Band competition. They were also named 2010, 2012, and 2014 Winners of the Mark of Excellence National Wind Band Honors. In 2016, the marching band competed in the UIL State Marching Contest, finishing in the top 20.

Mrs. Royall has presented at several state Conventions, including TMEA and TBA, as well as the Midwest Clinic. She also conducted three ensembles at the Midwest Clinic. Mrs. Royall served a seven-year term on the executive board for the Texas Bandmasters Association and served as president in 1999. Mrs. Royall is a member of TMEA, TBA, TMAA and Phi Beta Mu. In 1999, she received the University of Houston, Moore's School of Music, Distinguished Alumnus Award. In 2009, she received the TBA Meritorious Achievement Award. Presently, she is serving Texas band directors as a consultant/clinician and mentoring student teachers as a field supervisor for the University of Houston and Sam Houston State University.
