#### FREN 3380: French Culture & Civilization:

Students portray the overall picture of the role played by French culture and civilization throughout the world. Instruction is in French.

FREN 4364: Modern French Usage and Conversation: Students of all levels, including those seeking oral proficiency focus on extemporaneous speech and conversation dealing with modern topics. Instruction is in French.

### Requirements:

Minimum of 2.5 overall, GPA. Prerequisite: Grade of C or better in FRENCH 1411, 1412, 2311, and 2312 or equivalent.



# PROGRAM DETAILS

The SAM in France (Aix-en-Provence) study abroad program offers SHSU students an immersive French-language experience. Located in the university town of Aix-en-Provence. students will enhance their listening, speaking, reading, and writing skills in French through daily interactions with local speakers and classroom instruction. The program, organized in partnership with CEA, lasts four weeks, during which students will live with host families and engage with the local community in various settings. Proximity to cultural and historical sites like Marseille, Nice, Cannes, and Monaco enriches the experience, allowing students to explore and deepen their understanding of French culture.

## \*Important Information regarding scholarships:

- Students must have a 2.75 GPA to be eligible for all scholarships.
- Scholarships are disbursed one month before the student travels.

# **ESTIMATED PROGRAM COST**



The Global Engagement Center offers merit-based scholarships to assist qualifying students in covering some of the expenses of studying abroad. Each year, we award approximately \$100,000 in scholarships. However, funds are limited, and scholarships are given on a first-come, first-serve basis. While students can apply for up to three scholarships, it is unlikely they will receive all three due to the limited funding. We highly recommend applying early, after submitting your study abroad application, to increase your chances of receiving an award.

## Aix-en-Provence, France

#### FAQs (Frequently Asked Questions)

Welcome to the SAM Study Abroad 2025 program in Aix-en-Provence, France! We are excited to provide you with essential information to help you prepare for this amazing adventure. This FAQ document aims to address the most commonly asked questions and concerns students may have when considering the program. ## Q1. Can I make installment payments for the program fee?

A1: No but you will have plenty of time to make the payments toward your trip. Please note that the Global Engagement Center will post the program fee (i.e., \$4220) on **February 23**, and students will have until **May 1** to pay the trip fees (i.e., SHSU tuition + SHSU study abroad service fee). ### Q2. What is the total cost of the program, and can you provide a breakdown of the expenses?

A2: The total program cost and a detailed breakdown can be found on the attached estimated program cost sheet.

#### Q3. Can you describe a typical class day and the course structure?

A3: A typical class day will include approximately 3-4 hours of lectures, workshops, and interactive activities, providing a well-rounded educational experience. A course binder with a detailed class schedule and course structure will be provided upon acceptance into the program.

# Q4. What travel documents do I need? Is a passport necessary, and are there required vaccinations for the trip?

A4: Yes, a valid passport is necessary for international travel. For students holding U.S. passports, visas are currently not required but the EU might be requiring some type of travel visa starting next year (see link for more details: <a href="https://www.cntraveler.com/story/americans-will-need-visa-for-the-eu">https://www.cntraveler.com/story/americans-will-need-visa-for-the-eu</a>

For students holding non-U.S. passports, a Schengen visa is required. Please note that all visitors holding U.S. passports will only be allowed to stay in the Schengen Area for a maximum of 90 days before being required to leave.

Additionally, all students must be vaccinated against COVID-19 to be eligible to participate in this program per CEA CAPA policy.

#### Q5. What are the due dates for program enrollment and payment?

A5: Program Application Deadline: February 1 (Application portal is open NOW and space is limited)

- A \$200 study abroad service fee is due when you commit to the program \*This fee is non-refundable after 2/9/2025
- The remaining amount (tuition, program fee) will be due on 5/01/2025

Program Start Date: May 29

Program End Date: June 28

### Q6. Can you provide specific arrival and departure dates for the semester program?

A6: Recommended Departure date (from Texas): May 27

Arrival date (in Texas): June 29

### Q7. Are there daily extracurricular activities or excursions planned for students?

A7: Yes, we have a variety of daily activities and cultural excursions designed to enhance your overall experience in Aix-en-Provence. These activities include two 1-day trips (one to Marseille and the other to Avignon) as well as a French Cooking Class. More details will be included in the program schedule that will be provided in your course binder.

# Q8. Are there scholarship opportunities available for the program, and when are the application deadlines?

A8: Yes and there are **four** different scholarships that students can apply for:

- World Languages and Cultures Scholarship (\$1000)
- SHSU Bearkat Abroad Scholarship (\$1200)
- Bearkat Abroad Ambassador Scholarship (\$2000)
- Faculty Guided Global Exchange Scholarship (\$1000)

\*\*\*CEA CAPA also has scholarships that students can apply for. Review the Scholarship & Grants page on our website for information and deadlines.

<u>Please note:</u> Students must have a 2.75 GPA to be eligible for all scholarships. Information about available scholarships and their respective application deadlines can be found on our website. We encourage you to explore these opportunities to support your study abroad journey.

#### Q9. Will transportation from the airport be provided?

A9: Yes. Our third-party program organizer (CEA CAPA) will provide airport pick-up at Marseille Provence Airport (Airport Code: MRS) for students arriving on the official program arrival date (i.e., May 29) between the hours of 8:00 AM and 6:00 PM. Return transportation to the airport on the program end date is **not** included. Students must submit flight information 42 days prior to the program start date and arrive within the specified times above in order to be eligible for CEA CAPA airport pick-up. Students who are not scheduled to arrive by plane at the Marseille Provence Airport (MRS) within the specified timeframe will not qualify for airport pickup and are considered independent arrival participants.

# Q10. Will transportation to the school be provided, or should students be prepared to walk or use public transportation?

A10: No. However, CEA CAPA will provide local transportation passes to students for the duration of the program.

## Q 11. How will housing and meal plans work?

A11: Students will be housed in shared homestays with daily breakfast and 5 evening meals per week. There will also be an arrival orientation organized by CEA CAPA which includes a welcome group meal and a guided tour of the city. There will also be a farewell meal on the last day of the program. The rest of the meals during the program will be purchased by students on their own. More specific information will be provided during orientation.

## Q11. Will there be a meeting for interested students to learn more about the program?

A11: Yes, we will host a meeting for interested students to provide in-depth program details, answer questions, and help you make informed decisions about this exciting opportunity. Stay tuned for announcements regarding the meeting.
