
We appreciate all of Jaiden's hard work and dedication, and we look forward to seeing his continued success. Keep up the great work, Jaiden!

# Men's Rugby Claims Title of State Champions

For the third consecutive time, Men's Rugby has claimed the title of state champions. This marks the team's fifth state championship victory in the Lone Star Conference. To reclaim the trophy, they had to win three consecutive matches in a single tournament weekend.

The team faced the University of Houston and Texas State before advancing to the final against Baylor. Despite rainy conditions and a muddy pitch, they dominated their first two games. Against UH, they shut out their opponents on the Bearkats' home pitch with a commanding 34-0 victory. In the second match, they maintained control with a solid 26-5 win. The championship final proved to be their highest-scoring match of the tournament. Taking on the Baylor Bears, the team delivered a dominant performance, closing out the game with an impressive 41-7 victory to secure yet another title.





Their dominance extended beyond Rugby 15s, as they also asserted their superiority in Rugby 7s. About a month after their state championship victory in 15s, the team claimed another victory in 7s with a 5-0 record in their most recent home tournament. They faced Angelo State University, Rice, and Louisiana Tech before advancing to the semifinals against UT and ultimately defeating Texas A&M in the final match.

Beyond the scores, the team's success was a testament to their relentless preparation and unwavering determination. With another championship added to their legacy, they now shift their focus to future challenges, determined to continue their dominance both within and beyond the Lone Star State.
