Joining the BMB is a Two-Step Process:

- 1) Enroll in MUEN 1116 or 3116
 - a. 1st and 2nd year brass, woodwind, and colorguard students should enroll in Prof. McBryde's section, MUEN 1116 01
 - b. 1st and 2nd year percussion students should enroll in Dr. Jeffries' section, MUEN 1116 02

- c. All 3rd year more students should enroll in Prof. McBryde's upper level section, MUEN 3116 02
- 2) <u>Register for Summer Band</u> Registering for summer band allows us to know the following pieces of information about you:
 - a. Your preferred name
 - Clothing sizes (we are ordering shirts very soon please don't make us guess your size!)
 - c. Your instrument
 - d. If you need early dorm access or not
 - e. If you need a hotel during leadership, drumline, or colorguard camp

BMB Practice Schedule:

Take note of our class schedule. We require students to be available for all class times. Enroll in your courses early so that you may schedule your labs and specialized classes around the BMB course times.

2025 Games:

As you may know, Bowers, our stadium, is under construction and will not be ready for the 2025 season. Home games will be held at Shell Energy Stadium in Houston. The BMB

typically performs at all home games. Mark these dates on your calendar. BMB Members are required to attend all performances.

- Thursday, October 9th at 7pm (Homecoming)
- Wednesday, October 15th at 6pm
- Saturday, November 15th at Noon (Twirler Day Armed Forces Recognition)
- Saturday, November 29th at Noon (Saturday after Thanksgiving)

Potential Post-Season Games:

- SHSU competes in Conference USA. The top two teams in Conference USA will play a championship football game on December 5, 2025, at the stadium of the No #1 ranking team. Please keep December 4-6th available.
- Conference USA is a Bowl Conference. In December 2024, SHSU competed against Georgia Southern at the New Orleans Bowl. Bowl
- Though no one can yet predict opportunities that lie ahead, we can do our best to cheer the Bearkats on and be available if needed for post-season games.

2025 Exhibition Performances:

- High School Band Day—It is very *tentatively* set for September 20th at Bowers (this event will look differently than it has in the past).
- UIL Area I Contest, Katy, Texas, October 25th (All Day)
- Faculty, Friends, and Family Show an opportunity for our Huntsville community to see our exhibition show since all our performances will be in Houston this year. We will hold this exhibition during our regularly scheduled practice time at Bowers (if construction allows) on Monday, October 27th.

Leadership Meeting and Housing:

- Graduate Assistants, Drum Majors, Student Assistants, Visual Techs, Music Techs, Drumline Captains, and Colorguard Captains (guard and drumline as available) will meet on Saturday, 8/16/25, from 9 am to 4 pm.
- Leaders requiring a hotel room for the leadership day should note that in their <u>Summer Band registration</u> forms by July 20th.

Colorguard and Drumline Camps:

- Colorguard Camp Thursday & Friday, August 15th & 16th
- Drumline Camp Thursday through Saturday, August 15th through the 17th.
- Colorguard or Drumline students requiring hotel rooms for their extra camp days should note that in <u>Summer Band registration</u> forms by July 20th.

Early Move-Ins for Campus Housing:

- BMB woodwind, brass, and percussion members living in campus housing are must move in early on Sunday, August 17^{th,} from noon-3pm.
- Filling out the <u>Summer Band registration</u> form allows us to provide your Sam ID to Reslife for a smooth early move-in day.

First Year Students and Bearkat Kick Off Activities:

- Students in the leadership team along with pep-band members will perform as part of the convocation band.
- First-year BMB students should participate in convocation along with every other first-year student in the university.

- Bearkat Kick Off, a program designed for first-year students, begins on Thursday, August 21st, and ends on Saturday, August 23rd. First-year BMB students should attend BMB practices on Thursday evening, all day Friday, and join BKO on Saturday (unless auditioning for the School of Music ensembles).

• Once you register for summer band, Prof. McBryde will send your ID number to Bearkat Kick Off leaders, so they know not to expect you.

BMB Band Camp Schedule:

Agenda for Band Camp:

• It is important that you attend every second of band camp practice. In just five days, the BMB will be able to perform the entire Pre-Game show, learn stand tunes, and have a plan mapped out for the 8/29 halftime show! While we will be spending some time rehearsing fundamentals and working on our signature BMB sound, we will need to start learning shows right away!

Instruments:

- Members of the BMB march with the following instruments:
 - Flutes
 - Clarinets
 - Alto saxophones
 - Tenor saxophones
 - Trumpets
 - Mellophones
 - Trombones
 - Baritones
 - Sousaphones
 - Battery percussion instruments
 - Flags/Rifles (as decided by our instructor)
- The BMB provides students with the following instruments:
 - Mellophones
 - Baritones
 - Sousaphones
 - Battery percussion instruments

- A very limited number of tenor saxes to be decided upon during summer band
- Flags
- Students wishing to march bass clarinet must provide their own instrument.
- The BMB loans instruments at no cost to the members, provided the instruments are returned in satisfactory condition. Repair costs for broken or damaged instruments will be the responsibility of the student.

Supplies Needed:

Use this summer to acquire your BMB supplies!

- Insulated water jug for practices
- Marching shoes You may use your black shoes from high school (they must be flat black, not shiny or patent).
- Khaki shorts no cargo pockets
- Short black socks for summer uniform
- Long black socks for formal uniform
- Black athletic shorts to wear under formal uniform
- Black belt to wear with khaki shorts for summer uniform
- We do have some flip folders for students that prefer to use paper music. However, you must provide your own lyre if needed. Since we are using BEAM, and you will access stand tunes on your phone, you may choose to purchase a phone lyre holder for your instrument like <u>this one</u>. This is not a requirement, but you may find it helpful.
