Contacting the VA or your local Courthouse may be a bit more time consuming but will be quicker than requesting your DD-214 through your Congressman or The National Archives which could take months.

The National Archives and Records Administration is committed to protecting the health and safety of visitors, customers, and employees during the COVID-19 (coronavirus) pandemic. The Rotunda of the National Archives Building in Washington, DC, will open for viewing of the Declaration of Independence, U.S. Constitution, and Bill of Rights with limited capacity from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. on Saturdays and Sundays starting May 15, and including Monday, May 31, and Monday, July 5, for the Memorial Day and July 4th holiday weekends. Reserve timed entry tickets on Recreation.gov. The reopening of the Rotunda and its continued operation will be contingent on local public health metrics remaining below targets for safe reopening.

The museum at the Richard Nixon Presidential Library at Yorba Linda, CA, has opened to the public with limited capacity from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m., Wednesdays through Sundays,

All other museums are closed at this time. Some NARA museums and research facilities are reopening to the public on a limited basis. We are making every effort to continue providing essential services whenever possible, using online and remote capabilities. Further Expansion of Onsite Workforce at the National Personnel Records Center (NPRC) is Underway

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the NPRC has been closed and only completing emergency requests. As of March 29, 2021, the NPRC increased its on-site staffing to 25 percent of the workforce. While we continue to increase our on-site staffing, we are still servicing requests associated with medical treatments, burials, and homeless veterans seeking admittance to a homeless shelter. Please refrain from submitting nonemergency requests such as replacement medals, administrative corrections, or records research until we return to pre-COVID staffing levels.

If you have been impacted by a natural disaster and need priority service to replace a Separation Document (usually DD Form 214 or equivalent), place the word "Natural Disaster" in the "Comments" section of eVetRecs or in the "Purpose" section of the Standard Form (SF) 180, Request Pertaining to Military Records.

(NOTE: This fax number is only for special requests, such as hurricanes and other natural disasters)

It depends on the date the service member separated from the military. Military personnel records are open to the public 62 years after they leave the military. (To calculate this, take the current year and subtract 62.) Records of any veteran who separated from the military 62 (or more) years ago can be ordered by anyone for a copying fee (detailed below under "cost"). See Access to Military Records by the General Public for more details.

But what if it's been less than 62 years?

· Records of individuals who left service less than 62 years ago are subject to access restrictions and only limited information or copies may be released to the
